TOSSUP 1

TOSSUP 2

Warning: Two answers required.

Among the rules: The antagonist could stop at any time, if he were not a fanatic. Gravity is the antagonist's greatest enemy. Logically, the protagonist must stay on the highway. All action must be confined to the natural environment of the two characters -- the southwest American desert. FTP, what Chuck Jones-created animated duo, who first appeared in 1949's "Fast and Furry-ous," is permitted no dialogue with the exception of "Beep-Beep?" Answer: _ROAD RUNNER_ (Speedius speedius) and Wile E. _COYOTE_ (Droolibus hungrius)

TOSSUP 3

This group defended Malaysia against Indonesian forces in the 1960s, and hunted SCUDs during the Gulf War. Conceived in 1941 by Scots Guard subaltern David Stirling as a small force capable of disabling airfields held by Rommel's Afrika Corps, it later took on counterterrorist missions such as the 1980 liberation of the Iranian embassy in London. "Who Dares, Wins" is the motto of, FTP, what British regiment specializing in covert military operations?

TOSSUP 4

Its chants can heal the sick and return vision to the blind, and pearls fall from its beak when it sings. Also known as Zshar-ptitsa, it feeds on golden apples such as those which grow in the garden of the ogre Kashchei. Ivan Tsarevich learns how to defeat Kashchei when he summons this creature by waving one of its radiant feathers. FTP, what is this winged title character of a 1910 Stravinsky ballet?

Answer: the FIREBIRD

TOSSUP 5

A man named Trevilian was the only survivor of this place because he rode a white horse up to high ground at Perranuthnoe. All that remains to view of it are the mountain peaks known as the Isles of Scilly. The birthplace of Sir Tristram, this land to the west of Cornwall was supposedly swept under the sea after the death of Arthur. Situated beyond Land's End was, FTP, what lost kingdom of southwestern England?

Answer: _LYONESSE_ or _LEONOIS_

TOSSUP 6

He was born after his father was killed while on active military duty, and early in his life he suffered a severe, unidentified trauma. He became a Messianic figure after overcoming his sensory blocks, but as a child he was physically tortured by his Cousin Kevin and sexually molested by his Uncle Ernie. Nevetheless, he was London's "deaf, dumb, and blind" pinball wizard. FTP, name this title character of the Who's 1969 rock opera.

TOSSUP 7

This group of chemicals is responsible for the distinctive smell of a new car. Although these elasticizers have been used in plastics since 1930, recent findings by the National Environmental Trust have prompted Toys 'R' Us to remove all direct-to-mouth toys for children under 6 containing them from their shelves. FTP, what are these vinyl softening agents which have caused liver and kidney damage when ingested by laboratory animals?

TOSSUP 8

He resigned from the Russian Army after the Bolshevik Revolution to organize the White Guards, who defended his native country from Communist insurgents in 1918. He came out of retirement in 1931 to lead Finnish defenses through the end of its involvement in World War Two and served as President from 1944 to 1946. FTP, name this Finnish general after whom a line of fortifications facing Leningrad was named.

Answer: (Field Marshal) Baron Carl Gustav Emil _MANNERHEIM_

TOSSUP 9

Three of the offspring of Gaia and Uranus, these monsters personified earthquakes and other forces of nature. Although Gyges and Cottus later revolted and were permanently imprisoned in Tartarus, they had fought alongside the Olympians against the Titans, with Briareus serving as Zeus' personal bodyguard. FTP, name these monsters who each had fifty heads and one hundred arms.

Answer: _HECATONCHIRES_

TOSSUP 10

The title character is a priestess of Artemis, and it is her duty to prepare captive foreigners for sacrifice on the orders of King Thoas. Although Pylades and his companion are captured while attempting to steal a statue from the temple, they escape when the companion and the priestess realize they are related. FTP, in which Euripides play is Orestes reunited with his sister who was supposedly sacrificed at Aulis?

Answer: _IPHIGENIA IN TAURIS_ Do not accept: Iphigenia at Aulis

TOSSUP 11

In an interview in 1965, this painter wondered aloud if her pictures were "more lyrical, because I'm a woman?" Soon after returning from college to New York in 1949, she developed "stain painting," the process of pouring thinned paint on to an unprimed canvas and spreading it with sponges. FTP, name this former wife of Robert Motherwell and abstract expressionist painter of "Mountains and Sea" and "Ocean Desert".

Answer: Helen _FRANKENTHALER_

TOSSUP 12

Philip Morris recently acquired several product lines from this division of the Brooke Group Limited for three hundred million dollars in cash. With the loss of the L&M, Chesterfield, and Lark brands, this company only retains one premium line of cigarettes, Eve. FTP, this was the ironic fate of what "turncoat" company which several months earlier had made public documents incriminating the tobacco industry?

TOSSUP 13

In _The Golden Book of Springfield_, he portrayed a futuristic Utopian government by art and poetry. TOSSUP 14

His Presbyterian weekly, the St. Louis Observer, espoused freedom of the press and freedom of speech. He moved his Observer to Alton, Illinois, where he was killed by another mob on November 7, 1837, while attempting to install a new press. FTP, name this "Martyr on the Altar of American Liberty."

TOSSUP 15

TOSSUP 18

If the state granted one of them his independence, they joined the ranks of the neodamodes [nee-o-da-MOE-dez]. The ephors declared war on them every year and they were patrolled by the Krypteia [krip-TAY-ee-a]. Ethnically, they consisted of the conquered peoples of Messenia and the non-Dorian natives of Laconia. FTP, who were these state-owned serfs of ancient Sparta?

TOSSUP 19

A. For 5: This compound has formula C-8-H-10-N-4-O-2 and is a stimulant. It sublimes at 176 degrees Celsius and, although odorless, has a very bitter taste.

B. For 10: The nux vomica tree is the chief source of this poisionous alkaloid. It has been used as a rat poison and, after initial symptoms which include tremors and cramps, causes death from asphyxiation.
