10. Legalized in 1984, this museum graces the city of Cremona, Italy. FTP, give the name of this group of museums famed for displaying legal fakes of artistic works by Degas, Van Gough, Gauguin, and Renoir, just to name a few.

11. This spirochetal disease is a multisystemic illness that can affect the central nervous system (CNS), causing both neurologic and psychiatric symptoms. Early signs could include meningitis, encephalitis, and cranial neuritis, along with some associated psychiatric reactions such as paranoia, dementia, and panic attacks. FTP name this disease that sometimes has a latency period of months or years after skin infection, and is named for a small town in Connecticut where it was first discovered.
