BEDTIME FOR BONZO

2. Technically, it can't be applied to any novel that was created before Goethe's *Wilhelm Meister's Apprenticeship*. Later examples of the genre include Eichendorff's *Presentiment and the Present* and Keller's *Green Henry*. Better-known examples are Mann's *The Magic Mountain* and Dickens' *David Copperfield*. FTP identify this term, which is used to denote a work tracing the personal development of a person, which comes from the German for "novel of education".

3. There are over 100 species of this member of the lily family. Mostly grown in Europe and America, basic varieties include the thick-stemmed Argenteuil, which is grown in France, and the smaller and more flavorful Green variety. The plant produces flowers and white berries, but it is the stems of the plant that are primarily eaten. FTP name this sulfur rich vegetable.

ASPARAGAS

4. Originally called "the Pelican", it underwent a name change after a failed mutiny attempt by Thomas Doughty. Doughty was executed for this attempt, but in order to quash any ill will over the incident; the ship changed its name to refer to the image of a deer appearing on Doughty's coat of arms. FTP name this ship, whose most famous voyage occurred from December 1577 to September 1580, where it and Sir Francis Drake circumnavigated the globe.

THE GOLDEN HIND

- ~~5. On the left, are a pit that has various creatures emerging from it, an elephant, the Fountain of Life, and the Tree of Knowledge. In the middle, are several naked people eating giant berries and engaging in various sexual acts. On the right, various tortures are depicted such as being entangled in a harp and being stuffed~~

in a large horn. FTP these are the descriptions of the panels to what Hieronymous Bosch triptych?

THE GARDEN OF EARTHLY DELIGHTS

6. This deceased University of Chicago professor used the Television Infrared Observation Satellite to help map wind patterns. He also introduced the terms “wall cloud” and “tail cloud”. Through his studies of weather-related airplane disasters, he was able to identify the phenomena of downbursts and microbursts. FTP identify this scientist, who developed a scale to classify tornadoes.

TETSUYA THEODORE FUJITA

7. It is the “M” in the security types abbreviated CMO and CMBS. You can model their prepayments by using the Public Securities Association Model or by analyzing data collected by the FHA. Some of the many types available include “two-step”, growing equity, adjustable-rate, and balloon. FTP identify this type of loan that is usually taken out on a commercial property or a home.

MORTGAGE

8. This mythological figure wears what is known as a “wind jewel” around his neck and is sometimes depicted wearing a jaguar bonnet. Along with his twin brother, he went to hell to retrieve some human bones. He then applied his blood to the bones and created human resurrection. He also taught his people the concept of the calendar and gave them the discovery of corn. FTP who was this plumed god known to the Aztecs and Mayans?

QUETZALCOATL

9. The Bush administration has recently reaffirmed a 1987 decision that bars this man from visiting the U.S. The reason for this ban is suspicions over whether he participated in Nazi atrocities, charges that Foreign Minister Benita Ferrero-Waldner called “baseless and unjust”. FTP identify this former world leader, who once lived in New York when he was secretary of the U.N.

KURT WALDHEIM

10. Unlikely heroes on this team included Gary McLain, Dwayne McClain, and Harold Jensen. Led by center Ed Pinckney, this team achieved success through its zone defense, which held its opponents in the tournament to an average of 50 points per game. FTP name this 1985 NCAA basketball tournament winner, which was also the lowest seed to ever win the tournament.

VILLANOVA

11. Developed during the 1930's and 40's, it works by the phenomenon of auto-electronic emission. In order to take one, you need a room lit by a red light and a Tesla generator. The specimen is placed above some film and then high voltage is applied. FTP the preceding details what process, which is used to create a picture of someone's aura?

KIRLIAN PHOTOGRAPHY

12. This West Point grad originally resigned from military fighting, and settled in Rhode Island to produce his breech-loading rifle. When the Civil War broke out, he became a colonel in the Rhode Island Volunteers and later was promoted to brigadier general in the Union Army. He eventually replaced George McClellan as commander of the Army of the Potomac. FTP identify this whiskered man.

AMBROSE BURNSIDE

13. Its name is derived from Guarauno words meaning "a place to paddle". With ~~major tributaries of Cunucunuma, Padamo, and Mavaca; this river's source is the Guiana highlands. From there it flows through rain forest and llanos until it reaches the Atlantic Ocean.~~ FTP what is this river, whose basin covers 366,000 square miles and is one of the longer rivers in South America?

ORINOCO

14. He was exiled to the Caucasus due to his poem denouncing court circles. As a result of his exile, many of his works are set in that area. Mostly a poet, his poem "Son" is worthy of note, since it detailed a death similar to his eventual death in a duel. FTP name this Russian author, who created the hero Pechorin for his only completed novel titled *A Hero of Our Time*.

MIKHAIL YURYEVICH LERMONTOV

15. A Washington Newspaper recently ran an ad condemning this country's current administration for "manifest incapacity, intolerance, demagoguery, deceit, [and] arrogance". The ad also claimed the administration was influenced by China and Cuba, things President Hugo Chavez denies. FTP name this member of the Organization of American States and OPEC.

VENEZUELA

16. She became the wife of King Ahasuerus after his original wife, Queen Vashti, defied one of his orders. On the advice of her father, Mordecai, she did not reveal the fact that she was Jewish. But, when Haman made a decree to kill all the Jews, she pleaded with her husband to spare her people. FTP identify this woman, who is commemorated in the feast of Purim and the book of the bible that bears her name.

ESTHER OR HADASSAH

17. He used the term “style of life” to refer to an individual’s goals and how they pursue them. This “style of life” is established at age 4 or 5; while another one of his theories, that of a “social interest” is established at birth. This “social interest” refers to people placing the good of society above their own interests. FTP identify this psychiatrist, who also coined the terms “individual psychology” and “inferiority complex”.

ALFRED ADLER

18. Born in 1908 in the city of Gjirokaster, this man went on to teach at a school in Korce. When Italy invaded his homeland, he was fired from his job for refusing to join the Fascist Party. Later he had a change of heart and with the help of some Yugoslav communists he went on to form his country’s Communist Party. FTP identify this man, who for 40 years was leader of the country of Albania.

ENVER HOXHA

19. First recognized in 1836 by Theodor Schwann, some industrial uses for it include removing hair from animal hides needed for leather making and recovering the silver from old photographs. In order to do its most noted function, it needs to be in an environment with 1-3 pH. FTP identify this enzyme, which along with chymotrypsin and trypsin, is one of the three protein-degrading enzymes in the human body.

PEPSIN

20. This woman’s brother forces her to marry Arturo, even though she is in love with Edgardo (who happens to be her brother’s main rival). Just after marrying Arturo, this operatic title character ends up going insane and killing him. She then ends up dying as well. FTP identify this operatic title character created by Gaetano Donizetti.

LUCIA DI LAMMERMOOR
(FIRST OR LAST NAME ACCEPTABLE)

21. In this novel, Emily de St. Aubert is raised by her father in Provence. When her father dies, her aunt becomes her guardian and she takes Emily to her lover’s Gothic Castle. When her aunt dies, Emily returns to Provence to solve a mystery relating to her birth. FTP this is the plot to what 18th century Gothic Novel, penned by Ann Radcliffe?

THE MYSTERIES OF UDOLPHO

22. Having an area of 65 square miles, it was originally established in 1916 as Sieur de Monts National Monument and in 1919 became a national park under the name Lafayette. Most of this park resides on Mount Desert Island, which is dominated by the 1,500 ft Cadillac Mountain and the Anemone Cave. FTP name this park found off the coast of Maine.

ACADIA NATIONAL PARK

23. This king's mother, Blanche of Castile, served as regent in his early years. During his reign, he negotiated the Treaty of Corbeil to get Provence and Languedoc, reformed the courts and tax system of France, and instituted the practice of trial by jury. FTP identify this king and friend of Thomas Aquinas, who was later canonized.

LOUIS THE NINTH
ACCEPT: ST. LOUIS ON EARLY BUZZ

24. This mineral has a similar composition to Anhydrite, except that Anhydrite doesn't contain water in its structure. Sometimes it forms in sandy areas and creates the "desert rose" form. Other forms that it comes in include satin spar, selenite, and alabaster. FTP what is this mineral, that is used in the making of Plaster-of-Paris, and number 2 on the Moh's scale of hardness.

GYP SUM

25. The main character in this drama is a stoker on a ship. His life begins to fill with disillusionment, when a society girl inspects him and his fellow workers. He ends up at a New York zoo, where he realizes the ape is his closest in kin. He then releases the ape, which ends up killing him. FTP this describes what Eugene O'Neill play?

THE HAIRY APE

26. Favorable data has just been released on Exubera, a form of this medication. What makes Exubera unique is that it is in dry powder form that is meant to be inhaled. A recent study showed that Exubera was successful in maintaining glycemic levels in the body. FTP, Exubera is a form of what medication, which is taken by people afflicted by diabetes?






