PRECIOUS

3. There is so much symmetry to these that, in order to get a decent X-ray crystallograph (kris-tall-o-graf), osmic acid had to be used to break the symmetry. When reacted with three moles of rubidium, a superconductor with a critical temperature of 30 kelvins is produced. FOR 10 POINTS, give the common nickname of this 60-atom allotrope of carbon.

FOR 10 POINTS, name this maybe mythical pre-historical advanced civilization.

10. These animals of the order Proboscidea (pro-bo-SID-ee-uh) are characterized by thick, loose skin, elongated upper incisors, and, of course, their most distinctive feature, which you can probably guess assuming you know what a proboscis is. FOR 10 POINTS-- name these creatures with trunks.

11. Lumberjacks hold a contest in this sport every year, but it's much more effectively done in Washington, where it refers to Congresspeople exchanging support for one another's local-interest legislation. FOR 10 POINTS-- what is this term?

12. With all sub-denominations counted together, it's the third largest Protestant group in the U.S. as well as the state religion of the countries of Scandinavia. FOR 10 POINTS -- name this religion that originated in Germany, in a little town called Wittenberg.
