5. During the Hundred Years War, this educational institution sided with England against its native France. Founded in 1253 as a dormitory for 17 theology students, it was an early proponent of scientific method. It claims to be Europe's oldest University and is recognized as France's greatest. FTP what landmark of Paris' Latin Quarter is this?

6. Professional hockey's 1967 Best Rookie went on to take many more trophies in his career. A three-time winner of the Hart Trophy for most valuable player, he also won the Norris Trophy for best defenseman eight consecutive times, from 1968 to 1975. FTP, name this Boston Bruin great.

12. She arrived on Capitol Hill in 1972, after serving with distinction as the first black state senator in Texas since the Reconstruction. After three terms, she resigned unexpectedly and taught public policy and ethics at the University of Texas. FTP, name this member of Congress whose compelling opening remarks to Watergate hearings brought her national recognition.

19. He created the symbol of Santa Claus as a big, jolly, bearded man to cheer up people during the Civil War. Later, his political cartoons helped break Boss Tweed's political machine in New York City. FTP, name this cartoonist best known for popularizing the Democratic donkey and creating the Republican elephant.

Thomas NAST

20. This musician moved to New York at the age of 18 to locate his idol, Charlie Parker. He joined Parker in live appearances and toured with others before leading his own bop groups in the 1940s. Tired of bop, he helped create cool jazz and freeform. FTP, name this musician who recorded "Bitches' Brew" and "Round Midnight".

E1. He may not be the only bit character to appear in the original StarTrek, Star Trek movies, and Star Trek the New Generation, but he is the oldest. In his final appearance he is suffering from a Vulcan version of Alzheimers and his demise is announced to his only son by Captain Picard in an episode taking place on the Romulan home world. FTP, who was this father of Spock?
