3) This two word phrase was introduced by archaeologist Gordon Childs. He laid out 10 criteria, including foreign trade and large-scale public works, which he believed indicated civilizations had reached this point. Later workers have stressed social organization and the development of food surpluses as necessary preconditions. FTP, name this process wherein small agricultural societies is transformed into large city-oriented ones.

4) The origin of his legend is the Evangelium Nicodemi and was developed by Robert de Boron in the 13th century. A member of the Sanhedrin, he was released from prison by Emperor Vespasian, whereupon he moved to Britain and founded the abbey at Glastonbury. FTP, name this Jew, who brought Longinus's spear and the Holy Grail to England.

5) In 1945, he discovered that 2,4-dinitrofluorobenzene, a compound now most commonly known by his name, would attach itself to one end of a chain of amino acids but not the other. Over the course of the next eight years, he used this technique to decipher the order of amino acids in the insulin molecule. FTP, name this winner of 1958 Nobel Prize in Chemistry.

6) Anawhata, who ruled from 1044-1077, was the first king to rule over all of this country by capturing the Mon rulers in the South. He converted his people to Theravada Buddhism. FTP, what country did he rule, from his pagoda-filled capital of Pagan on the Irrawaddy River?

7) Season Hubley, Donald Pleasance, Lee Van Cleef, Adrienne Barbeau, Harry Dean Stanton, Ernest Borgnine, Isaac Hayes, and Kurt Russell. These stars make up the cast of this 1981 John Carpenter film about the rescue of the US president from an island prison by war hero Snake Plisskin. FTP, name this film whose sequel, Escape from Los Angeles, is currently in production.
