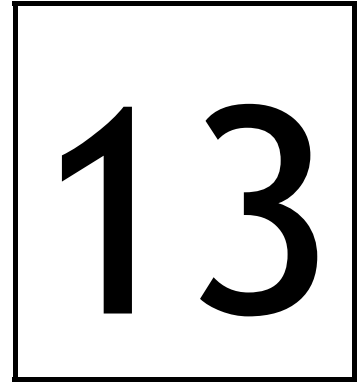


# PENN BOWL 11

**1** Name these Hemingway characters, 10 points each.

[10] He is the protagonist of *The Old Man and the Sea*.

ANSWER: Santiago

[10] The protagonist of many Hemingway short stories, including “The Killers,” he is often seen as Hemingway’s alter ego.

ANSWER: Nick Adams [prompt on “Nick”]

[10] The main character of *To Have and Have Not*, he was played by Humphrey Bogart in a 1944 movie.

ANSWER: Harry or Harry Morgan

**2** Name these operas from lovers, 10 points each.

[10] Leonore and Florestan

ANSWER: Fidelio [accept Leonore]

[10] Violetta and Alfredo

ANSWER: La Traviata

[10] Erik and Senta

ANSWER: The Flying Dutchman or Der Fliegende Holländer

**3** Today, it contains a total of 33 characters. 10 points each.

[10] Name this official alphabet of the Russian language.

ANSWER: Cyrillic

[10] Like St. Cyril, this saint was sent to Moravia in the 9<sup>th</sup> century AD to bring an alphabet to the Slavs.

ANSWER: St. Methodius

[10] The language and alphabet originally used by Cyril and Methodius live on in the name of a mass by Czech composer Leos Janacek. Name either.

ANSWER: Old Church Slavonic or Old Church Slavic or Glagolitic [accept Msa Glagolskaya]

- 4 *Pencil and paper ready.* Place the following countries in geographical order from *north* to *south*: Belarus; Estonia; Latvia; Lithuania; Moldova; and the Ukraine. You will receive 5 points per correct answer, provided *all* answers are in the correct relative order. You must give at least two answers. *You have 10 seconds.*

ANSWER: Estonia □, Latvia □, Lithuania □, Belarus □, Ukraine □, Moldova □

- 5 Name these Canadian bodies of water, 10 points each.

[10] This bay is bordered to the east by Greenland.

ANSWER: Baffin Bay

[10] Banks Island and the Queen Elizabeth Islands are bordered to the west by this sea.

ANSWER: Beaufort Sea

[10] This large lake lies just south of Great Bear Lake in the Northwest Territories.

ANSWER: Great Slave Lake

- 6 Answer these questions about Germany's "long 19<sup>th</sup> century," 10 points each.

[10] In what year was the Second Reich proclaimed?

ANSWER: 1871

[10] Who claimed that "blood and iron" would solve the issues of German unification?

ANSWER: Prince Otto Eduard Leopold von Bismarck

[10] This elderly general designed and led Prussia's victory in the Franco-Prussian War.

ANSWER: Graf Helmuth Karl Bernhard von Moltke the Elder

- 7 30-20-10. Name the organization.

[30] Oliver Hudson Kelley, a Department of Agriculture worker, shocked by a tour of the South during Reconstruction, returned to Minnesota to found it.

[20] The most prominent court case resulting from its activities was 1877's *Munn v. Illinois*.

[10] Also called the Patrons of Husbandry, it opposed the monopolistic practices of railroad magnates.

ANSWER: National Grange [accept Patrons of Husbandry for 20 or 30]

8 He first postulated that elements' atomic weights might be multiples of the weight of hydrogen. 10 points each.

[10] Name this English biochemist.

ANSWER: William Prout

[10] Prout's proposal was important enough that this scientist, who discovered the proton, named it after him.

ANSWER: Baron Ernest Rutherford of Nelson, of Cambridge

[10] Prout also discovered that this acid was a crucial component of gastric secretions.

ANSWER: HCl or hydrochloric acid

9 Name the winning English generals at the following battles, 10 points each.

[10] Waterloo, 1815                      ANSWER: Arthur Wellesley, 1<sup>st</sup> Duke of Wellington

[10] Blenheim, 1704                      ANSWER: John Churchill, 1<sup>st</sup> Duke of Marlborough

[10] Megiddo, 1918                      ANSWER: Edmund Henry Hynman Allenby

10 Conjoin the following people, 10 points each.

[10] The actor who played George on *Seinfeld* and a 13<sup>th</sup> century Russian prince.

ANSWER: Jason Alexander Nevsky

[10] A Republican Senator from Colorado and the actor who played a Yale grad in *Dying Young*.

ANSWER: Ben(jamin) Nighthorse Campbell Scott [prompt on partial answer]

[10] David "Jill" Jilefsky on *Jack & Jill* with the first pole vaulter to clear 20 feet.

ANSWER: Ivan Sergei Bubka

11 Name these Ibsen plays, 10 points each.

[10] Dr. Stockman finds an entire town set against him when insists the town's famed Baths are unsanitary and must be shut down for repairs.

ANSWER: *An Enemy of the People* or *En folkefiende*

[10] Elida Wangel gives her soul to a traveling sailor. She has a happy marriage until the sailor returns.

ANSWER: *The Lady from the Sea* or *Fruen fra havet*

[10] In love with Manders, Helen marries Captain Alving instead. When her son comes home with syphilis, she must confront her past.

ANSWER: *Ghosts* or *Gengangere*

**12** How well do you remember the Hardy Boys? 10 points per part.

[10] Five points each—what were the first names of the Hardy Boys?

ANSWER: Frank and Joe

[10] Leslie McFarlane, among others, wrote the Hardy Boys series under this pseudonym.

ANSWER: Franklin W. Dixon

[10] This 1927 novel was the first Hardy Boys mystery.

ANSWER: *The Tower Treasure*

**13** Dmitri Shostakovich, unlike many composers, lived to complete more than nine symphonies. 10 points each.

[10] How many symphonies did Shostakovich write?

ANSWER: 15

[10] This popular symphony written in 1937 features a triumphant march in a minor key, a jab at Stalin.

ANSWER: *Symphony No. 5 in D minor*, Op. 47 [accept equivalents]

[10] Shostakovich's *Symphony No. 11* is named after this year, the year the Treaty of Porstmouth was signed.

ANSWER: "*The Year 1905*"

**14** Name these Thomas Hardy novels, 10 points each.

[10] After a troubled marriage to Sergeant Troy and a love affair with Boldwood, an insane farmer, Bathsheba Everdene sees the purity of Gabriel Oak's love and marries him.

ANSWER: *Far from the Madding Crowd*

[10] During the Napoleonic Wars, Anne Garland is courted by Festus Derriman, Bob Loveday, and Bob's brother, John, the title character.

ANSWER: *The Trumpet Major*

[10] Dick Dewey and Vicar Maybold both propose to young schoolmistress Fancy Day, but her newfound maturity compels her to marry Dick.

ANSWER: *Under the Greenwood Tree*

**15** Name these measures of inflation, 10 points each.

[10] The most common measure, it uses the prices of a "basket" of consumer goods to gauge inflation.

ANSWER: CPI or Consumer Price Index or cost of living index

[10] Published with the GDP, this index measures the nominal part of GDP growth; it accounts for all national purchases, not just household purchases.

ANSWER: GDP deflator

[10] Most recently, Alan Greenspan has paid greater attention to this index which measures changes in labor costs.

ANSWER: ECI or employment cost index

**16** Answer these questions on the Peloponnesian Wars, 10 points each.

[10] The largest land battle of the war was fought in 418 BC near this city in Arcadia.

ANSWER: Mantineia

[10] The turning point of the war was Athens's disastrous expedition to this island in 415 BC.

ANSWER: Sicily

[10] This Athenian general, a friend of Socrates and relative of Pericles, suggested the expedition to Sicily; accused of blasphemy, he fled to Sparta.

ANSWER: Alcibiades

**17** Name these international directors from a pair of films, for the stated number of points.

[5] *The Monster, Life is Beautiful*

ANSWER: Roberto Benigni

[10] *Ride with the Devil, Sense and Sensibility*

ANSWER: Ang Lee

[15] *The Princess and the Warrior, Run Lola Run*

ANSWER: Tom Tykwer [TIK-ver]

**18** Name these sinners from Dante's *Inferno*, 10 points per part.

[10] For 5 points each—these two lovers are in the ring of lust for committing adultery after reading an Arthurian romance.

ANSWER: Paolo and Francesca

[10] This great Florentine politician in the circle of heretics is still so proud "he holds all hell in his scorn." He delivers a prophecy on Dante's forthcoming exile.

ANSWER: Farinata

[10] Boniface VIII convinced this friar to help in the siege of Palestrina. As a reward, he was turned into a talking flame. His words open "The Love Song of J. Alfred Prufrock."

ANSWER: Guido da Montefeltro

**19** They are the only surviving members of the subclass *Prototheria*. 10 points each.

[10] Name this order, with just three extant species, one of which is the platypus.

ANSWER: monotremes or Monotremata

[10] Monotremes belong to what taxonomic class?

ANSWER: Mammalia or mammals

[10] The other two species of monotremes are the short-beaked and long-beaked varieties of what animal?

ANSWER: echidna or spiny anteater

**20** 30-20-10, name the baseball team given some of its players.

[30] Rogers Hornsby, Pepper Martin, Marty Marion

[20] Dizzy Dean, Curt Flood, Bob Gibson

[10] Stan Musial, Lou Brock, Mark McGwire

ANSWER: St. Louis Cardinals [prompt on "St. Louis"]

**21** Name these two- or three-dimensional conic sections, 10 points each.

[10] Intersect a plane with the base of a cone at some angle so that it does *not* intersect the tip of the cone.

ANSWER: parabola

[10] Intersect a plane with the cone without intersecting the base *or* passing through the tip of the cone.

ANSWER: ellipse [do not accept "circle"]

[10] Slice off the top of a cone parallel to the base.

ANSWER: frustum [prompt on "truncated cone"; do not accept "frustrum"]

**22** Are squirrels sinister agents of darkness? 10 points each.

[10] This ill-mannered protagonist of a Beatrix Potter story loses part of his tail when he foolishly recites annoying riddles to an owl.

ANSWER: Squirrel Nutkin

[10] When Dilbert wrote a computer program to predict the future, it told him squirrels will soon stage a coup, forcing all humans to work here.

ANSWER: in their nut mine(s) [accept equivalents]

[10] In this 1963 Disney film based on a T.H. White Novel, young Wart's lessons are disrupted when he attracts the attention of a persistent, amorous female squirrel.

ANSWER: *The Sword in the Stone*

**23** Name these men from the legend of the Seven Against Thebes, 10 points each.

[10] This son of Oedipus gathered the Seven to take Thebes back from his brother Eteocles.

ANSWER: Polynices

[10] The Seven were primarily from this Greek city.

ANSWER: Argos

[10] This king of Argos, the leader of the expedition, was the only one of the Seven to survive.

ANSWER: Adrastus

**24** 30-20-10. Name the mythological figure.

- [30] Born from nine virgins who raised him on a diet of the strength of the Earth, the moisture of the sea, and the heat of the sun, he grew to full size in just a few days.
- [20] He sleeps lighter than a bird and can see one hundred travel days in all directions.
- [10] He will blow the Gjallerhorn to call the Aesir to Ragnarok, where he will kill and be killed by Loki.

ANSWER: Heimdall(r)

**25** Name these movies in which Christian Slater acts all crazy-like, 10 points each.

- [10] In this 1989 movie, Slater and Winona Ryder find love as they kill off a popular high school clique.

ANSWER: Heathers

- [10] Slater had a good reason for killing that pimp—Elvis's ghost told him to! Little surprise that Dennis Hopper plays Slater's father in this 1993 film with Patricia Arquette.

ANSWER: True Romance

- [10] In this 1998 flop, Slater puts his own inimitable stamp on a Las Vegas bachelor party by murdering a security guard to conceal a stripper's death.

ANSWER: Very Bad Things

**26** Name these early Christian heresies, 10 points each.

- [10] This heresy, adopted by many Germanic barbarians, held that the Son was a created being, less than the Father.

ANSWER: Arianism

- [10] Emphasizing Christ's dual nature, and denying Mary the title "Mother of God," this heresy, denounced by the Council of Ephesus, was popular in Central and East Asia.

ANSWER: Nestorianism

- [10] Started by Eutychius [yoo-TIH-kee-us], this quasi-heresy held that Christ had only one nature, divine. The Coptic Church is an outgrowth of it.

ANSWER: Monophysite or Monophysitism [do not accept "Aphthartodocetism"—Ed.]

**27** They include mosses and liverworts. 15 points each.

- [15] Name this primitive division of green, seedless plants.

ANSWER: Bryophyta or bryophyte(s)

- [15] All bryophytes use this system of reproduction involving a haploid, sexually reproducing gametophyte, and a diploid, asexual sporophyte.

ANSWER: alternation of generations [accept equivalents]

**28** Name the countries in which you'll find these archaeological sites, 10 points each.

[10] Newgrange ANSWER: Ireland

[10] Leptis Magna ANSWER: Libya

[10] Biskupin [bis-KOO-pin] ANSWER: Poland
