1. FEBRUARY 12, 1994 MARKED THE FIRST DAY OF THIS MONTH WHICH FALLS IN THE YEAR 1414 OF THE MUSLIM CALENDER. IT COMMEMORATES THE FIRST REVELATION OF THE KORAN TO MUHAMMAD. FOR TEN POINTS, NAME THIS MONTH DURING WHICH ANY INDULGENCE, INCLUDING EATING, IS FORBIDDEN DURING DAYLIGHT HOURS.

#### RAMADAN

2. THE NAME'S THE SAME. A 20TH CENTURY SICILIAN POET WHO LED ITALY'S HERMETIC POETS WHOSE WORKS INCLUDE "TO GIVE AND TO HAVE" AND WHO WAS AWARDED THE 1959 NOBEL PRIZE IN LITERATURE AND A CHARACTER WITH SEVERE KYPHOSIS CREATED BY VICTOR HUGO. FOR TEN POINTS GIVE THE SHARED NAME.

#### QUASIMODO (THE POET IS SALVATORE QUASIMODO)

3. IN CELLULAR COMMUNICATIONS, THESE MOLECULES ACTIVATE OR INHIBIT AN ENZYME IN RESPONSE TO EXTRACELLULAR MESSENGERS SUCH AS HORMONES BOUND TO A CELL SURFACE RECEPTOR. FOR TEN POINTS, GIVE THE NAME OF THIS MOLECULE, WHOSE RESEARCHERS WERE AWARDED THE 1994 NOBEL PRIZE IN MEDICINE.

#### G PROTEIN

4. This village in Southwest Georgia was the location of the most notorious confederate prison of the Civil War where 13,000 Union soldiers died thanks to its abhorrent conditions. FOR TEN POINTS, name this town which shared its name with the prison.

5. At 25 he became the court painter of Philip IV of Spain, making that monarch perhaps the most frequently portrayed king in history. His works include *Borrachos*, *The Forge of Vulcan*, and a portrait on Pope Innocent X, all displaying his mastery of light and compassion for his subjects. FOR TEN POINTS, name this prolific Spanish artist of the 17th century.

CHARLES BABBAGE

14. THEY WERE FOUNDED BY A.C. BHAKTIVEDANTA SWAMI PRABHUPADA IN 1966, AND QUICKLY GAINED PROMINENCE IN THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA. FOR TEN POINTS, IDENTIFY THIS HINDU SECT THAT TEACHES DEVOTION TO THEIR GOD AS A MEANS OF SPIRITUAL ENLIGHTENMENT, PARTICULARLY THROUGH THE CHANTING OF THE MANTRA, WHICH IS THE SAME AS THEIR POPULAR NAME.

HARE KRISHNA (ACCEPTS INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY FOR KRISHNA CONSCIOUSNESS BUT SHOOT THEM FOR SHOWING OFF!)

15. ITS MAJOR INDUSTRIAL CENTERS INCLUDE KHARKIV, DONETSK, AND DNIPROPETROVSK. ITS CHIEF PORT IS ODESSA ON THE BLACK SEA. FOR TEN POINTS NAME THIS REPUBLIC, THAT HAS GIVEN US GOLD MEDALISTS VIKTOR PETRENKO AND OKSANA BAIUL.

UKRAINE

16. NORMAN MAILER ONCE DESCRIBED HIM AS "THE MAGGOT GENIUS OF AMERICAN ART." FOR TEN POINTS, IDENTIFY THIS ARTIST WHOSE MULTI-IMAGE SILK SCREEN PAINTINGS MADE USE OF MONOTONY AND REPETITION, OFTEN OF MUNDANE HOUSEHOLD OBJECTS.

ANDY WARHOL

17. THIS AUTHOR PUBLISHED HUMOROUS SHORT STORIES IN THE 1870'S UNDER THE PEN NAMES "ANTOSHA," "A MAN WITHOUT A SPLEEN," AND "MY BROTHER'S BROTHER." IN 1884 HIS FIRST COLLECTION OF SHORT STORIES "TALES OF MELPOMENE" WAS PUBLISHED. FOR TEN POINTS, NAME THIS AUTHOR OF "THE SEAGULL" AND "UNCLE VANYA."

ANTON CHEKHOV

18. He was ordained a priest at age 28 in Venice in 1704. However his greatest claim to fame was not theology but sonatas and concertos. FOR TEN POINTS, name this Italian baroque master, who influenced Bach and wrote *The Four Seasons*.

Antonio Vivaldi

19. At the Battle of Lake Erie, Oliver Hazard Perry said "We have seen the enemy and they are ours" in this American War that also gave us The Star Spangled Banner. FOR TEN POINTS, name this war sometimes called "the second American war for independence."

WARREN M. CHRISTOPHER
