21 ✓ The Japanese economy is noted for having large conglomerates that tend to dominate the country's business activities. For ten points, what is the term for these conglomerates?

ANSWER: ZAIBATSU

3. Living in exile for most of his life, this man made a living as a newspaper writer, as a teacher and translator, and as a Uruguayan consul. His writings include *Jesse James*, *Simon Bolivar*, and *Versos sencillos*. FTP, name this Cuban, a revolutionary who died attempting to free Cuba from the Spanish.

ANSWER: Jose Marti

US 28 Charles Murray's *The Bell Curve* argues that there is an IQ gap between whites and blacks while population researchers Menozzi, Cavalli-Sforza, and Piazza claim in their recently released study of 100,000s in about 2,000 communities that human races are remarkably alike under the skin. For ten points, what are both groups studying to prove their point?

ANSWER: GENES

5. In Matthew 5:22 Jesus uses the term "Rah-KUH" which the King James translates as "Thou Fool." It is not from Greek or Hebrew, but from a popular tongue in Palestine which was replaced by Arabic. For ten points, name this dialect which was a group of languages related to Hebrew.

ANSWER: ARAMAIC

6. If $f(x)$ <read "f of x"> = x to the 5th power. What is the derivative of f ?

ANSWER: $5x$ to the 4th power

7. He was the first of Britain's Angry Young Men – angry at England, its society and even his five wives. He even openly rejoiced at his third wife Jill Bennett's suicide. He was the film writer of "Tom Jones" and "The Entertainer" which started Laurence Olivier. For ten points, who is this recently deceased playwright, best known for his first work, "Look Back in Anger."

ANSWER: JOHN OSBORNE

8. Dame Judith was a noted actress in the first half of the 20th Century, Robert surrendered at Fort Sumter, Marian was an alternate delegate to the UN and the first person of her race to sing in the White House, and Sherwood wrote about Winesburg, Ohio. FTP, identify the common name.

ANSWER: ANDERSON

9. "This driveway was not unlike that military training device known as an obstacle course." The name for this style of writing comes from two Latin words meaning "speaking around." For ten points, name the term for roundabout speaking?

ANSWER: CIRCUMLOCUTION

10. He graduated from Harvard in 1743, served as clerk of the Massachusetts General Assembly, and served as a delegate to the First Continental Congress, where he was a member of the Committee of Safety. For ten points, name this firebrand, the organizer of the Boston Tea Party.

ANSWER: SAMUEL ADAMS

11. San Quinten and Ensenada are located at its northern end, and La Paz and San Jose del Cabo are found in its far south. For ten points, what is the name of this elongated, 1400 kilometer Latin American peninsula?

ANSWER: BAJA CALIFORNIA

12. Oxygen consumption is measured as METS. One MET is the volume of oxygen you consume at rest. At its peak, sexual intercourse requires five METS, about the same as climbing two flights of stairs. For ten points, basically, what does METS stand for?

ANSWER: METABOLIC EQUIVALENTS

13. On July 1, 1942 the German High Command announced that they had captured one of the most fortified cities on earth. The Soviets said that 250 days of heroic resistance had inflicted 300,000 casualties on German and Romanian troops, before falling back in the Ukrainian sector. For ten points, name the largest port on the Black Sea.

ANSWER: SEVASTOPOL or SEBASTOPOL

14. The protagonist of this play holds her father responsible for preventing her from sleeping with her fiancée before he was killed in France. Nina Leeds eventually floats through a string of lovers in this nine act play. FTP, name this play by Eugene O'Neill that won the 1928 Pulitzer in Drama.

ANSWER: Strange Interlude

15. Donald Panoz started his company in a small Irish town of Athlone and specialized in reformulating other companies' drugs. Lately the company has moved more toward its own product line, including smoking-cessation patches and a wrist-watch-sized device that administers drugs that previously could only be injected. For ten points, name this \$600 million company whose French name means "spirit and style."

ANSWER: ELAN

16. This mineral is a good conductor of electricity, and it is used to make crucibles and electrodes. It is dark gray or black, greasy, and soft and can be found in many parts of the world. For ten points, identify this crystalline form of carbon which is mixed with clay to create its most common form.

ANSWER: GRAPHITE

17. This inventive British poet composed in more than 790 metrical forms, including deliberately bumpy meters and weird triple rhymes. A number of his poems concern romantic triangles with one of the three parties represented by a ghost. For ten points, who was this author of Winter Winds, Far From the Madding Crowd, and The Return of the Native?

ANSWER: THOMAS HARDY

18. Grief is something we all must go through, unless we die young. For ten points, who is the Swiss-American who first developed the concept of stages of grief that one must experience in her book on death and dying?

ANSWER: DR. ELIZABETH KUBLER-ROSS

19. The Philosopher, Miracle, Schoolmaster, Le Midi, Maria Theresa, and Hornsignal are just a few of the titles of his symphonies. Employed as kapellmeister to the Esterhazy family, he wrote at least 104 symphonies. For ten points, name this composer of the Clock and Surprise symphonies.

ANSWER: (FRANZ) JOSEPH HAYDN

20. Weathering is the combined action of all processes whereby rock is decomposed and disintegrated because of exposure at or near the earth's surface. Chemical weathering by humic acid is a major factor in decomposing rock in humid regions of the world. For ten points, name the sedimentary rock that most often is the weakest, and frequently forms valley floors in the humid Southeast.

ANSWER: LIMESTONE

21. His poem "The Revenge" is a stirring tale of an Elizabethan Seadog's fight with a fleet of Spanish Galleons, including such words as "God of Battles, Was there ever a battle like this before? And he said, Fight On!" For ten points, name this poet laureate of England, best known for "Crossing the Bar" and Idylls of the King.

ANSWER: ALFRED LORD TENNYSON

22. This Augustinian monk called for the reform of the Roman Catholic Church because he was fed up with the activities of Johan Tetzel, a monk who was selling indulgences. This professor nailed a theological treatise on the town bulletin board for debate. For ten points, name the German reformer who nailed the 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Cathedral.

ANSWER: MARTIN LUTHER

23. For a quick ten points, evaluate the following mathematical expression: i to the 21st power.

ANSWER: i

For ten points, name the play in which the magician Prospero utters these words after making a large group of spirits vanish.

25. He was a painter and sculptor who created cubist works and cofounded dadaism. For ten points, who is the creator of "The Bride Stripped Bare by Her Bachelors," "Fountain," and "Nude Descending a Staircase?"

ANSWER: MARCEL DUCHAMP

26. In ballet, it is a leap from one leg to the other in which one leg is thrown to the side, front, or back. For ten points, identify this term which means "thrown" in French.

ANSWER: JETE'

27. Her bankruptcy has not seemed to curtail her lavish life-style, but the New York Times has suggested her actions are a major reason for the economic precariousness of the town she party owns. For ten points, who is the owner of Braselton, Georgia.

ANSWER: KIM BASINGER

28. Tubular, star, triangular, and composite are all types of this substance formed by the sublimation of water vapor into solid crystals at temperatures below freezing. For ten points, what are these hexagonal crystals of winter?
