Henry MILLER

2. Before the Movie IQ, Tim Robbins and Meg Ryan were in another movie together. As minor characters they shared the screen with current TV drama stars Anthony Edwards and Tom Skeritt. For ten points name this movie named after a flight school in Miramar, California, starring Tom Cruise.

TOPGUN

3. From December 15, 1814 to January 5, 1815 a secret meeting of New Englanders discussed secession because of the Mercantile policies of President Madison. This meeting opposed the Federalists and wanted greater states rights. For ten points name this meeting, held in the "insurance capital of the US."

HARTFORD CONVENTION

4. Founded in 1881, this business school is named after its founder Joseph. It was the first collegiate school of management in the U.S. Some of its alumni include: Peter Lynch, Martin Zweig, Michael Milken, Ronald Perelman, and Donald Trump. For ten points name Business Week's top rated business school.

WHARTON (prompt if "Penn" or equivalent is given)

5. He was a apprentice linendraper in Amsterdam, but spent more time with his hobby of grinding lenses and studying tiny objects. In his studies he was the first man to see bacteria or protzoa. For ten points name this Dutch microscopist.

Antonie Van LEEUWENHOEK

6. As a child prodigy on the piano, he studied at the Paris Conservatory where his "first symphony" was composed in 1855. He was one the first Frenchman to compose symphonic poems. One of his major works is the "Carnival of Animals". For ten points name the composer of the opera Samson et Dalila.

Camille SAINT-SAENS

7. The region comprises the Oswego River watershed of the Lake Onterio draining system. It is the home to over 20 New York State parks and is known for its scenery. The region is named for the glacial lakes between Syracuse and Geneseo. For ten points name the region or the lakes,

which include Canadaigua, Keuka, Cuyuga, and the largest Lake Senaca.

FINGER LAKES

8. Born to a rich and powerful family in 15th century Florence, this writer and statesman's works include: the Mandragola, Discourse on the first 10 books of Titus Livius, and the Art of War. For 10 points name the writer of The Prince.

Niccolo MACHIAVELLI

9. When this high school star chose the University of Tennessee over his father's alma mater Ole Miss, he received many threats from fans. Thankfully he has been safe and as a Sophomore has led the Volunteers into the top 5. For ten points name this Heisman Trophy candidate, the son of the New Orleans Saint and Minnesota Viking Quarterback Archie.

Peyton MANNING

10. She was a military nurse in Canada during World War I and then later a social worker. She went on to marry publisher George Putnum. For ten points name this woman who with Fred Noonan and a Lockheed Electra in 1937 tried to fly around the world, but was lost near the international dateline.

Amelia AERHART

11. The name's the same. The CEO of the corporation which purchased CBS, and the son of the murder victim whose case is being tried in Lumberton, North Carolina. For ten points name either the Westinghouse CEO or the Chicago Bulls guard.

MICHAEL JORDAN (prompt if "Jordan" is given)

12. This British biochemist was born in Germany and shared the 1953 Nobel prize in Physiology or Medicine. He developed the cycle central to nearly all metabolic reactions which breakdown sugars, fats, or proteins. For ten points name this man whose name also refers to the citric acid cycle.

Edwin KREBS

13. For a quick ten points who is Greek god of Light and Truth, known as the healer and "the most Greek of all Gods"?

APOLLO (accept Phoebus)

14. This U.S. author said of her work "it explores a religious consciousness without a religion". Her works are usually set in the rural south and include The Violent Bear it Away. For ten points name the author of A Good Man is Hard to Find and Wise Blood.

(Mary) Flannery O'CONNOR

15. He was a legislative aide in the White House during the Nixon Administration. He received his Law Degree from New York University in

1965. Between 1979-1993 he was a Governor, US Secretary of Education, and a University President. For ten points name this Republican Presidential candidate from Tennessee.

Lamar ALEXANDER

16. For every pair of integers a and b , there exist some integers m and n such that m times a is equal to n times b . For ten points give the most common name of this theorem, which is NOT about leftovers from take-out food.

CHINESE REMAINDER THEOREM

17. After his father Taisho retired in 1926, he reigned Japan and his regime is called the Showa, or "enlightened peace". He married the princess Nagako Kuni, and was the longest reigning Japanese emperor. For ten points name this man whose son Akihito became emperor after his death in 1989.

Michinomiya HIROHITO

18. It is the home of the cash register and the automobile self-starter was invented in this U.S. city. It is the heart of a metropolitan area that includes Kettering, Xenia, Fairborn, and Oakwood. Also it houses the Wright Brothers bike repair shop. For ten points name this Ohio city home of Wright-Patterson Air Force base and a peace agreement in the Balkans.

DAYTON, Ohio

19. Sana and Aden came together and a new republic was born in 1990. This nation has the highest peak on the Arabian peninsula. For ten points name the recently combined country, which borders the Red Sea, the Arabian Sea, Oman, and Saudi Arabia.

YEMEN

20. He was a doctor and medical administrator in Russia, but worked more diligently on his writing. His short stories include: Murder, Neighbours, and The Black Monk. For ten points name the author of Ward Number 6, The Seagull, and The Cherry Orchard.

Anton CHEKHOV

21. Gambling loses the Bayou Classic, Blind Melon lead singer Shannon Hoon dies, and Harrah's Jazz company shuts down temporary gambling facilities and seeks bankruptcy protection. For ten points it should be easy to name the city where these big events occurred.

NEW ORLEANS

22. This badge consists of a white and gold cross with a red center bearing a crown and a laurel wreath. Holders of this medal may add DSO to the end of their name. For ten points name this badge which signifies the Distinguished Service Order and is named for a British Monarch.
