Perrault and Perot are homophones, meaning they sound alike and are spelled differently. Homographs are words like the following pair of adjectives, which are spelled the same, but pronounced differently. One describes a substance which has not been converted into atoms carrying a net positive or negative charge; the other describes a shop which has organized labor. FTP pronounce either of these adjectives.
