1. In 1898, he was appointed curator of the newly established Gustave Moreau Museum in Paris. During a spiritual crisis, he became obsessed with evil, which he saw everywhere. In his paintings, conventional values are overturned- judges are seen as ape-like monsters and whores as saintly women. FTP name this French artist who worked with stained-glass and is famous for the work *The Old King*.

\Georges Rouault(1871-1958)\

2. Published in 1951, it is the story of an upper-middle-class girl whose suicide is seen in a series of flashbacks-among them a country club dance, a Christmas dinner, a football game, and a wedding. The main character is the Virginia girl Peyton Loftis. FTP name the first novel of William Styron.

\Lie Down in Darkness\

3. In 1970, he became the world's first democratically elected Marxist President. 3 years later, he was killed during a military coup. He helped found the Socialist Party of his country in 1933. FTP name this politician from Chile.

\Salvador Allende\

4. He was sent to London in 1648 as an apprentice to the painter Peter Lely. But he abandoned this artistic pursuit to attend college where his chemistry professor, Thomas Willis, helped him get a job assisting Robert Boyle improve the air pump. FTP, identify this scientist who in 1665, put forth his undulatory theory of light in his *Micrographia*.

\Robert Hooke\

5. His children's books include *The Lost Zoo* and *My Lives and How I Lost Them*. He also wrote the 1931 novel *One Way to Heaven*. Strongly influenced by Keats, his poetry was published in such collections as *The Medea and Some Poems* and *Copper Sun*. FTP, identify this 1903-born Harlem Renaissance figure best-known for the 1929 collection *The Black Christ and Other Poems*.

\Countee Cullen\

6. A leader of this religion imposed a "uniform" on the male faithful, called the "Five Ks": uncut hair, a comb, a band on the right wrist, a dagger, and short pants. Their scripture is the *Adi Granth* or the *Guru Granth Sahib*. FTP name this religion founded during the early 1500's in Sultanpur, near Amritsar by Guru Nanak.

\Sikhism\

7. The fourth measure provided that the territory east of California ceded to the U.S. by Mexico was divided into the territories of New Mexico and Utah and be open to both slaveholders and antislavery settlers. The fifth measure provided that Texas be awarded \$10 million in settlement of claims to adjoining territory. The third bill was the Fugitive Slave Law. The first 2 measures authorized abolition of the slave trade in the District of Columbia and admission of California as a free state. FTP name these legislative measures sometimes referred to collectively as the Omnibus Bill.

\Compromise of 1850\

8. His beliefs included spontaneous generation, the fact that heavenly bodies were rotating spheres, and that terrestrial motion was regulated by the principle of inertia such that all bodies desired to be at rest at the center of the earth. His zoological studies led him to classify 540 animal species, 50 of which he had dissected. FTP, identify this Greek best known for his chicken embryology and his doctrine of the 4 mutually convertible elements.

\Aristotle\

9. In this battle, German pikemen and Spanish arquebusiers of Holy Roman Emperor Charles V's army under Ferdinando Francesco d'Avalos defeated a French army of heavy cavalry. The French army was led by Francis I and was aided by Swiss and German mercenaries. FTP name this battle which gave Spain control of Italy, fought in 1525.

\Pavia\

10. Edgardo in Donizetti's *Lucia di Lamermoor*, Liu in Puccini's *Turandot*, Cio-Cio San in Puccini's *Madame Butterfly*, and Juliet in Gounod's *Romeo and Juliet* all have this in common. FTP how also does Verdi's *Otello* die?

\suicide (by stabbing)\

11. In its best known version it runs: 'Act only on the maxim through which you can at the same time will that it be a universal law'. More generally known as the Moral law, it is formulated from the idea that morality begins with the rejection of non-universalizable principles. FTP name this keystone of Immanuel Kant's ethics.

\Categorical Imperative\

12. This estate was deeded to Harvard in 1940 by the American diplomat Robert Woods Bliss. In 1944 it was the site of conversations conducted by representatives of the U.S., China, Great Britain, and the Soviet Union, that resulted in Proposals named after this estate. FTP name this estate which shares its name with the basic plan from which the charter of the United Nations was developed at the San Francisco Conference in 1945.

\Dumbarton Oaks\

13. At times a painter, he also drove an ambulance in Europe during World War I, but then, so did everyone else. Author of a play, *Santa Claus*, and composer of a ballet, *Tom*, his most important works are considered to be the drama *Him* and the novel *The Enormous Room*, though he is best-known for his poetry. FTP, identify this American poet whose collections, including *XLI Poems* and *Tulips and Chimneys*, showcase his unusual punctuation and typography.

\e e\_cummings\_\

14. Among its major tributaries are the Zeya, Sungari, Ussuri, and Bureya rivers. It is formed by the junction of the Shilka and Argun rivers. About 2,865 km long, it empties into the Tatar Strait. FTP name this river that for almost 1,610km forms the border between Russia and China.

\Amur river\

15. One account says that she flies through the air with the wings of a falcon. In Wagner's *Ring of the Nibelungs*, she was given to the giants as payment for their construction of Valhalla. FTP, who was this daughter of Njord, owner of the necklace Brisingamen, and Norse goddess of love?

\Freya\

16. He was the illegitimate son of Godigiselus, who led an invasion of Gaul. He succeeded his brother as king in 428. The next year he led all his people from Spain to Africa. After a triumphant progress across northern Africa, he captured Carthage in 439, and made the city his capital. Later, he sacked Rome in 455, invaded Greece and Dalmatia, and threatened Constantinople. FTP name this man who from 428-477 was king of the Vandals.

\Gaiseric or Genseric\

17. They were first discovered in the early 1950s by Christian de Duve. Between 0.5 and 1.0 micrometers in diameter, they are surrounded by a single membrane. Synthesized on the rough endoplasmic reticulum, they are then transported to the Golgi apparatus in an inactive form. They pass through the Golgi, become activated, and then bud off the end of the Golgi. FTP, identify these cellular organelles, named for their role in cellular-level digestion, that store hydrolases.

\Answer: primary\_lysosome\_ (accept lysosome; don't accept \_secondary lysosome\_)\

18. His spectacular career ended in 1918 when he became the victim of schizophrenia, from which he never fully recovered. Earlier, he had choreographed Debussy's *L'Après-midi d'un faune* and *Jeux* and Stravinsky's *The Rite of Spring*. A Russian dancer and choreographer, he took lead roles in ballets such as *Petrushka*. FTP name this legendary member of Diaghilev's Ballet Russes.

\Waslav Nijinsky\

19. In 1513, he purchased 800 building stones and a barrel of lime to construct a tower for making observations of the night sky. From these observations, he concluded that the universe is finite, spherical in shape, and that celestial bodies always move in a circular motion. FTP, identify this person who in his, *Commentariolus*, put forth his heliocentric theory of the solar system.

\Nicolas Copernicus\

20. When he was only 19, he published his first book of poems *Luna silvestre*. In 1968, after 25 years in the diplomatic service, he resigned his post as ambassador to India to protest his government's suppression of a student-worker demonstration. His most prominent theme is human ability to overcome existential solitude through erotic love and artistic creativity. In *The Labyrinth of Solitude*, he analyzed his home country of Mexico. FTP name this 1990 winner of the Nobel Prize.

\Octavio Paz\

21. Born in Little Britain, New York, he was a brigadier general in the American Revolution, who was prevented by his military duties from signing the Declaration of Independence. He was twice elected vice president: in 1804, serving under Thomas Jefferson, and in 1808, under James Madison. FTP name this first governor of New York.

\George Clinton\

22. In 1825, in order to make possible a civil service career, he resentfully converted from Judaism to Protestantism. The conflict between his liberal views and the oppressive regime in Prussia drew him to Paris in 1831 and he remained there for the rest of his life. In 1835, a Prussian edict prohibited his writings in Germany, naming him as a leader in the Young Germany movement with which he had been only peripherally associated. FTP name this German poet, satirist, and journalist who wrote *Book of Songs* and *Germany, A Winter's Tale*.

\Heinrich Heine\

23. The principle entrance into this structure is the Redeemer's Gate through which everyone must take off their hat when passing through. Occupying 90 acres, its name comes from the Russian for a citadel. For ten points, what is this triangular structure situated in the middle of Moscow?

\Kremlin\

24. This novel is set in the imaginary South American republic of Costaguana. Charles Gould, head of the Gould concession silver mine in the province of Sulaco, entrusts his silver to this title character, which is the nickname of an Italian named Capatez de Cargadores. Afterwards it is believed that the silver had sunk into the sea and the suddenly wealthy Capatez is shot by an old lighthouse keeper by the end of this 1904 novel. FTP, what is this novel by Joseph Conrad?

\Nostromo\

25. He was born in New York City and educated at Rutgers University and the University of Chicago. Among his books are Capitalism and Freedom and A Monetary History of the United States, 1867-1960. Considered a leading protagonist of the economic theory that free market forces, rather than increased government intervention, can most effectively produce a balanced and noninflationary rate of economic growth, he is an exponent of the policy that the Federal Reserve System can best promote economic stability by increasing the supply of money at a fairly fixed rate instead of sharply expanding or contracting it. FTP name this 1976 winner of the Nobel Prize in economics.

1. In 1901 he founded an influential weekly paper, the Commoner. His writings include Heart to Heart Appeals (1917) and The Bible and Its Enemies (1921). FTP name this Sec. of State from 1913- 1915.  
\William Jennings Bryan(1860-1925)\

2. After the succession of Mary, he was burned at the stake. After the succession of Edward VI, he was largely responsible for the 2 Books of Common Prayer and the 42 Articles. Earlier in 1529, at the request of Henry VIII, he prepared a treatise justifying the invalidity of the K's marriage to Catherine of Aragon. After becoming archbishop, he declared the marriage void and pronounced the marriage of the K to Anne Boleyn valid. FTP name this Archbishop of Canterbury from 1533-1556.  
\Thomas Cranmer(1489-1556, A of C 1533-1556)\

3. His writings include a widely read speech, Industrial Unionism (1911), and Walls and Bars (1927). Between 1871 and 1883 he was a locomotive fireman on the Terre Haute and Indianapolis Railroad, a wholesale grocery salesman, and city clerk of Terre Haute. In 1885 he served as a member of the Indiana legislature. He was grand secretary and treasurer of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen from 1880 to 1893, when he resigned to organize and become president (1893-97) of the American Railway Union.  
\Eugene Victor Debs(1855-1926)\

4. With Sir John Hawkins, a relative, he abandoned the cross-Channel trade for more adventurous and lucrative buccaneering expeditions to the Spanish main. In 1577, he embarked in the Pelican to explore the Pacific and, reaching the Strait of Magellan in 1578, renamed his ship the Golden Hind. FTP name this Englishman who in 1572 during a raid on the Isthmus of Panama sighted the Pacific.  
\Sir Francis Drake\

5. Performing breeding experiments and cytological analyses on *Drosophila melanogaster* (vinegar fly), he and his graduate students Alfred Henry Sturtevant, Calvin Blackman Bridges, and Hermann Joseph Muller revealed that chromosomes behave very similarly to the ways in which Mendel believed genes segregate and become randomly assorted. Discovering also that genes for many character traits are arranged in a linear fashion on each chromosome, he and his coworkers created linear chromosome maps in which each gene is assigned to a specific position. FTP name this 1933 winner of the NP in Physiology or Medicine.  
\Thomas Hunt Morgan(1866-1945)\

6. Her marriage was arranged by Thomas Cromwell to strengthen English links with Protestant Europe. The K having been encouraged beforehand of Holbein the Younger's portrait of her, found her unattractive. Plus K Henry VIII came to favour a Catholic alliance, so he divorced this 4th wife. She lived in England after the divorce.  
\Anne of Cleves(4th, 1515-1557)\

7. Educated at Oxford, Cambridge, and Lincoln's Inn, he then inherited and squandered a huge fortune. He became in 1621 dean of St. Paul's. FTP name this preacher and Metaphysical poet.  
\John Donne(1572-1631)\

8. During the American Civil War, he was assistant to his friend John Nicolay, private secretary to Lincoln. During this period he and Nicolay collected the material for the two monumental works on which they later collaborated: Abraham Lincoln: A History (10 vol., 1890); and Abraham Lincoln: Collected Works (2 vol., 1894). He was ambassador to Great Britain in 1897-98 and then served until his death as secretary of state to McKinley and Roosevelt. As secretary he directed peace negotiations after the Spanish-American War (1898), secured U.S. influence in the Pacific by annexing the Philippines, and in China initiated (1899) the Open Door Policy, which guaranteed equal trade opportunities for all countries. FTP who in 1901 he negotiated the a treaty, which opened the way for U.S. construction of the Panama Canal?  
\John Milton Hay(1838-1905)\

9. B in NYC, she moved to Athens at age 13, making her first major appearance there in 1941 as Tosca. She began her career in dramatic roles such as Isolde, Brunnhilde, and Aida. After 1949, encouraged at the La Scala opera by her mentor, the Italian conductor Tullio Serafin, she turned toward coloratura bel canto roles. FTP name this American operatic soprano, the preeminent prima donna of her day, and the first modern soprano to revive forgotten operas of the bel canto repertoire.  
\Maria Callas(pro nom de Maria Anna.. Kalogeropoulos 1923-1977)\

10. He wrote Gullible's Travels and You Know Me, Al.  
\Ringgold or "Ring" Lardner(1885-1933)\

11. In 1926 he visited the Soviet Union and thereafter became increasingly swayed by socialism. Later, increasingly involved in the promotion of world peace and nuclear disarmament, he became chairman of the Peace Information Center in New York City in 1950,

but the next year the organization was declared subversive by the U.S. government. FTP name this first black to get his Ph.D. from Harvard.

\W.E.B. Du Bois(1868-1963)\

FTP name this confed cavalry general who served as the 1st leader of the original Ku Klux Klan.

\Nathan Bedford Forrest(1821-1877)\

4. In 1955 he was appointed head of Operation Deep-Freeze, an Antarctic expedition organized by the U.S. in connection with the International Geophysical Year (1957-58). Early in 1956 Byrd made his third flight over the South Pole. He left the expedition shortly thereafter. He wrote Skyward (1928), Little America (1930), Discovery (1935), and Alone (1938).

\Richard E. Byrd(1888-1957)\

5. He studied music with Thomas F. Ward, an organist, in Jacksonville. Returning to Europe, he later studied at the Leipzig Conservatory. In 1888 Edvard Grieg persuaded his father to permit him to follow a musical career, and two years later he settled in Paris. His music was appreciated first in Germany. Later, through the efforts of Sir Thomas Beecham, the English conductor, his music became known in Great Britain and in the U.S. Delius suffered paralysis and blindness in 1926 and thereafter composed by dictating. Among his works are the opera Fennimore and Gerda (1910); the works for orchestra Brigg Fair (1907) and On Hearing the First Cuckoo in Spring (1912). FTP who composed A Village Romeo and Juliet(1910)

10. In this country's recent election, groups included the Servant of Construction and the Association of Combatant Clergymen. The leader of the liberal Servants of Construction is (P) Hashemi Rafsanjani. FTP name this country which in 1979 came to be ruled by the Ayatollah Khomeini.

\Iran\

11. He was born in Prince Edward County, Virginia, and educated at the U.S. Military Academy. At the start of the Civil War, he resigned from the U.S. Army and joined the Confederate army, which commissioned him a brigadier general. At the First Battle of Bull Run in July 1861, he came to the assistance of General Pierre Beauregard and is given much of the credit for that first important Confederate victory. As commander of Confederate forces along the Mississippi in 1863, however, he was unable to prevent the capture of Vicksburg by General Ulysses S. Grant, and he failed to stop General William T. Sherman from taking Atlanta in 1864.

\Joseph Johnston\

12. He graduated (1921) from the Helsinki Polytechnic School. His first buildings to gain wide acclaim were a newspaper office and plant (1927-30) in Turku, notable for the use of tapered columns to support the pressroom roof, and the superbly sited Paimio Tuberculosis Sanatorium (1929-33), in which the patients' building provides, along with the most advanced hospital technology, such amenities as sunlit balconies with a fine view. For this and for many other buildings, he and his first wife, Aino Marsio, also designed all furnishings and fittings, often entirely of laminated wood. In 1935 they founded Artek, a firm. His int'l rep grew with his Finnish Pavilion for the 1937 Paris Exposition; the understated luxury of Villa Mairea (1938-39), built for a wealthy patron; and his innovative Finnish Pavilion for the 1939 New York World's Fair, with interior walls of undulating glass and molded wood. In 1940, Aalto was invited to the United States as a visiting prof at the MIT, where he remained for eight years and designed Baker House (1947), a striking serpentine-plan dorm. He returned to Finland in 1948 to head the planning office set up to rebuild that country following the devastation of WWII. His most impressive is Finlandia House (1967-75), the city's lakeside cultural center.

\(Hugo) Alvar Henrik Aalto(1898-1976)\

13. He was born in Hadley, Massachusetts, and educated at the U.S. Military Academy. During the Mexican War he was brevetted lieutenant colonel at Monterrey. With the outbreak of the American Civil War he was appointed brigadier general of volunteers, and in 1862 he became brigadier general in the Union army. In January 1863, Hooker was assigned by Abraham Lincoln to the command of the Army of the Potomac. The defeat of the Union troops at Chancellorsville in May 1863 was in large measure the result of Hooker's vacillation and inability to cope with the surprise actions of the Confederate leadership. In deference to Lincoln's lack of confidence in him and the pressure of public opinion in the North, he resigned his command of the Army of the Potomac the following July and was given command of the XI and XII Corps. He fought with distinction at Lookout Mountain, in the Battle of Chattanooga (November 1863), and was brevetted major general. In 1868 he retired from the army with the full rank of major general. FTP who has the nickname of "Fighting Joe"?

\Joseph Hooker(1814-1879)\

14. The Italian poet Ranieri Di Calzabigi collaborated with him on the operas Paris and Helen, Alceste, and Orpheus and Eurydice. FTP what native of Erasbach Bavaria composed Iphigenia in Aulis and Iphigenia in Tauris?

\Christoph Willibrand Von Gluck\

15. Like the central characters in some of his stories, he lost his father at an early age and rode the rails during the Depression.
